




Let's Play!

25 Playful Creative Things to do in Cork City


- 1 On this map, sketch your own little stained glass window inspired by St. Finbarre's
- 2 Trace the skyline stencils located on the top of Elizabeth Fort. Can you also spot any art murals from the fort walls?
- 3 Solve the tall picture puzzle in the Old Cork Waterworks Experience. Who can you see?
- 4 Did you spot the old cell graffiti with prisoners' names in Cork City Gaol? On this Playful Culture map, write your own name in a fun, creative style.
- 5 Find a piece of art in the Crawford Art Gallery with nature on it
- 6 Can you spot the exotic pineapple in the garden at Triskel Arts Centre
- 7 Find the curious Cork Horns in Cork Public Museum. What do you think they were used for?
- 8 The design of the Glucksman Gallery is environmentally friendly. Can you imagine an eco-friendly home inspired by this art museum?
- 9 Find the butter wrapper collection in the Butter Museum, can you imagine or draw your own butter wrapper design?
- 10 At Blackrock Observatory we can discover the secret to the skies. Why not try and draw a constellation on your map?
- 11 At St. Peters, find the sculpture gifted to the people of Cork! Do you think art can be used to show someone how you feel?
- 12 Find the salmon on the back of the chairs at Shandon Bells, can you draw your own little salmon on this map?
- 13 Can you find the colouring corners at Nano Nagle Place Museum?
- 14 Make a fairy house for Bláithín and friends in Fitzgerald Park using leaves and sticks
- 15 Strike a theatrical pose outside the Everyman Theatre
- 16 Climb Patrick's Hill and enjoy a wonderful picnic overlooking the city!
- 17 Explore some wonderful reading at Cork City Libraries and check out a book that inspires you.
- 18 Take a cycle trip down to the Marina
- 19 Hop on one foot on the Shakey Bridge
- 20 Learn how to draw Bláithín with the template on this map
- 21 Find the Ogham Stones in the quad at UCC and draw your own version
- 22 Spot the art murals throughout the city, how many can you find?
- 23 Make a wish at the Grand Parade fountain
- 24 Find Bláithín the Lizard at the attractions listed on this map
